

SFC Alan L. Boyer

Born in Chicago on March 8, 1946 to Charles and Dorothy Boyer. Alan graduated from MacArthur High School in 1964 in Decatur, IL. While attending the University of Montana he enlisted in the Army. He completed Airborne and Special Forces training and volunteered for the secret war of MACV-SOG.

He was listed as Missing-In-Action on March 28, 1968 in Laos. His remains were repatriated and identified by DNA in March 2016. There will be a funeral service with full military honors at Arlington National Cemetery on June 22, 2016. He is survived by his sister, Judi Boyer Bouchard of Leesburg, FL.

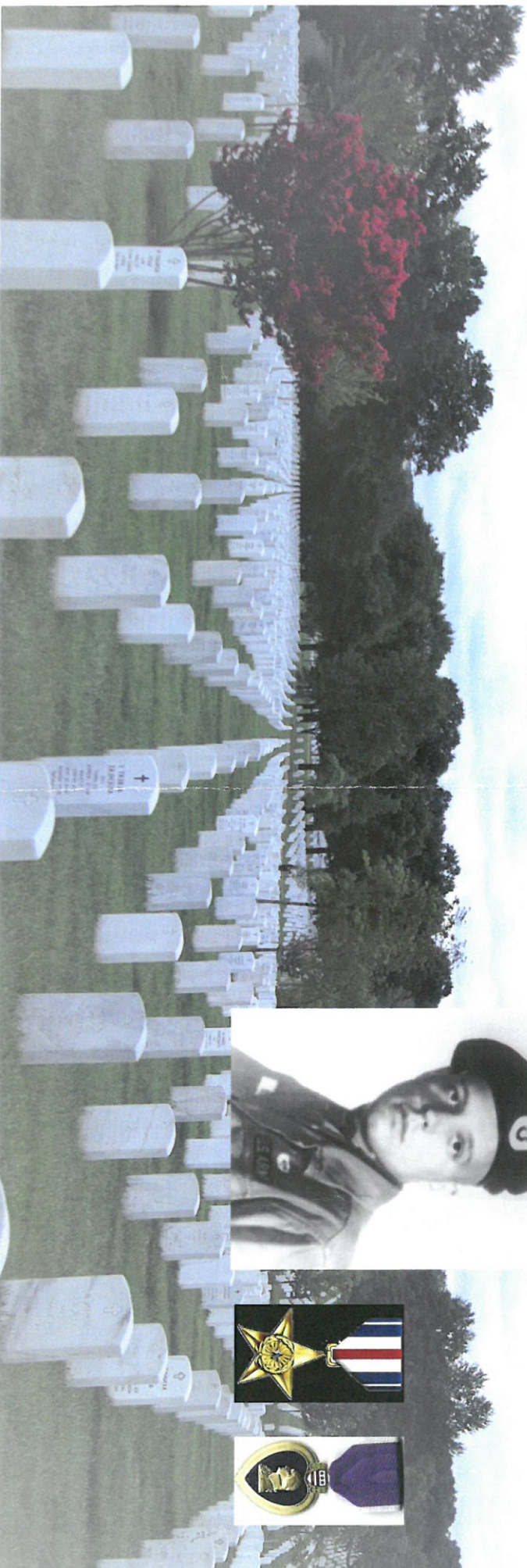
